growing parsley

Start planting: early spring + autumn Start harvesting: spring, summer - autumn Start with: plants Needs: morning sun + some afternoon shade



Step1



- Plant: Parsley
- Space & Light: Place your plant in full sun / partial shade
- **Container:** Get a medium container (12 in/ 30cm wide) with drainage holes at the bottom (min depth 12in/30 cm for soil depth of 8 in/20 cm)
- Soil: Choose a well-draining mix for containers
- Watering Can: Get a 2-3 gal/8-11 liters for containers





SHOPPING

Plant

Pick up one parsley plant. Check the bottom of the pot for healthy roots (not dried out)



Container

Get a medium container (12 in/ 30cm wide) with drainage holes at the bottom (min depth 12in/30 cm for soil depth of 8 in/20 cm)



Soil

Get a large bag of well-draining, organic potting mix for container gardening (30 dry quarts/ 28 liters)



Garden Gloves + Trowel


Watering Can Get a 2-3 gal/8-11 liters

Pro tip: Shop at your local garden center (not big home stores) for quality products and knowledgeable staff; only buy what you don't have

Step 2



- Fill the container with soil (right below the rim of the container)
- Dig hole deep enough to cover the entire root ball
- Gently remove plant from the pot
- Use both hands to place the plant in the soil
- Use one hand to hold the plant in place, other hand to cover the entire root ball with soil
- Water gently and evenly after planting



Step 3 grow



- Water Parsley regularly.
- Before watering, touch the soil. If it's moist, don't water.
- To avoid overwatering, watch before you water.



Step 4 core



- Parsley is low maintenance
- Good Pests (swallowtail butterfly larvae: colorful yellowishgreenish caterpillars) will munch a little and move on
- Leave them alone to nibble (although you may be tempted to pluck them off)
- Good news, they smell bad to predators which helps deter predators from your containers
- They'll fly away with their beautiful black wings and a dab of yellow and blue

Step 5 horvez



- Harvest 40-60 days from plants
- Snip the oldest leaves first; 2-3 leaves for tonight's dinner
- Grows 12-18 in or 30-45 cm tall

growing cilantro

Start planting: early spring + autumn Start harvesting: spring, summer - autumn Start with: plants Needs: full sun



Step1



- Plant: Cilantro (choose a slow bolt variety)
- Space & Light: Place your plant in full sun
- **Container:** Get a medium container (12 in/ 30cm wide) with drainage holes at the bottom (min depth 12in/30 cm for soil depth of 8 in/20 cm)
- Soil: Choose a well-draining mix for containers
- Watering Can: Get a 2-3 gal/8-11 liter for containers



SHOPPING checklist

Plant

Pick up one cilantro plant (slow bolt variety). Check the bottom of the pot for healthy roots (not dried out)



Container

Get a medium container (12 in/ 30cm wide) with drainage holes at the bottom (min depth 12in/30 cm for soil depth of 8 in/20 cm)



Soil

Get a large bag of well-draining, organic potting mix for container gardening (30 dry quarts/ 28 liters)



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Watering Can Get a 2-3 gal/8-11 liters

Pro tip: Shop at your local garden center (not big home stores) for quality products and knowledgeable staff; only buy what you don't have

Step 2




- Fill the container with soil (right below the rim of the container)

- Water gently and evenly after planting

Step 3 grow



- Cilantro loves water so water regularly.
- Before watering, touch the soil. If it's moist, don't water.
- To avoid overwatering, watch before you water.



Step 4 core



- Low maintenance herb when it's kept watered
- Harvest leaves often



Step 5 horves



- Harvest approximately 45 days from plants
- Use before weather warms up and it bolts (turns to seed)
- Snip the oldest leaves first; 2-3 leaves for tonight's dinner
- Grows 12-18 in or 30-45 cm tall

growing chives

Start planting: early spring + autumn Start harvesting: spring - early summer; autumn Start with: plants Needs: full sun

Step1 plan



- Plant: Chives
- Space & Light: Place your plant in full sun
- **Container:** Get a medium container (12 in/ 30cm wide) with drainage holes at the bottom (min depth 12in/30 cm for soil depth of 6 in/15 cm)
- Soil: Choose a well-draining mix for containers
- Watering Can: Get a 2-3 gal/8-11 liter for containers
- Fertilizer: Use a balanced fertilizer

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SHOPPING

Plant

Pick up one chives plant. Check the bottom of the pot for healthy roots (not dried out)



Container

Get a medium container (12 in/ 30cm wide) with drainage holes at the bottom (min depth 12in/30 cm for soil depth of 6 in/15 cm)



Soil

Get a large bag of well-draining, organic potting mix for container gardening (30 dry quarts/ 28 liters)



Fertilizer: Get a balanced, organic liquid fertilizer

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Watering Can Get a 2-3 gal/8-11 liters

Pro tip: Shop at your local garden center (not big home stores) for quality products and knowledgeable staff; only buy what you don't have

Step 2 plant



- Fill the container with soil (right below the rim of the container)
- Dig hole deep enough to cover the bulb and half of the white lower stem
- Gently remove plant from the pot
- Use both hands to place the plant in the soil
- Use one hand to hold the plant in place, other hand to cover the entire bulb and half of the white lower stem with soil
- Water gently and evenly after planting

Step 3 grow




- Apply a balanced fertilizer once a month (mix in with water in watering can); follow directions on the bottle
- Water: Before watering, touch the soil to be sure it's not moist.
- You don't want to overwater. Water regularly when needed.

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Step 4 core



- Water regularly and apply fertilizer monthly during the growing season.
- Pests: Aphids. Take your container to your sink or tub and wash them off with a strong stream of water.



Step 5 harvest



- Harvest approximately 30 days from plants
- Use scissors and cut a few stems at the base for tonight's dinner
- Grows 12 in or 30 cm tall




Start planting: early spring + autumn Start harvesting: spring - summer; autumn Start with: plants Needs: full sun



Step1 plan



- Plant: Dill
- Space & Light: Place your plant in full sun
- **Container:** Get a medium container (12 in/ 30cm wide) with drainage holes at the bottom (min depth 16 in/ 40 cm for soil depth of 12 in/ 30cm)
- Soil: Choose a well-draining mix for containers
- Watering Can: Get a 2-3 gal/8-11 liters



SHOPPING

Plant

Pick up one dill plant. Check the bottom of the pot for healthy roots (not dried out)



Container

Get a medium container (12 in/ 30cm wide) with drainage holes at the bottom (min depth 16 in/40 cm for soil depth of 12 in/30 cm)



Soil

Get a large bag of well-draining, organic potting mix for container gardening (30 dry quarts/ 28 liters)



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Watering Can Get a 2-3 gal/8-11 liters

Pro tip: Shop at your local garden center (not big home stores) for quality products and knowledgeable staff; only buy what you don't have

Step 2 plant




- Fill the container with soil (right below the rim of the container)
- Dig hole deep enough to cover the entire root ball
- Gently remove plant from the pot
- Use both hands to place the plant in the soil
- Use one hand to hold the plant in place, other hand to cover the entire root ball with soil
- Water gently and evenly after planting

Step 3 grow



- Water Dill regularly.
- Before watering, touch the soil. If it's moist, don't water.
- To avoid overwatering, watch before you water.




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Step 4 core




- Dill loves lots of sun and regular watering.
- Keep the height low by cutting back the main stem.



Step 5 harvest




- Harvest Dill approximately 4-5 weeks, when your plant is (5-6 in high)
- Trim by snipping small bits of dill for tonight's dinner
- Grows 1-5 ft or 30-152 cm tall
